Norman (A) and Joan (B) demonstrate this dialogue in which they discuss their living arrangements as well as their teacher's. Notice when they summarize everybody's information, they orient their signs in the direction of the person they are talking about.

Signer A: Ask if B lives alone
B: Reply
A: Ask if B has a pet
B: Respond
• size of pet(s)
• color(s) and markings of pet(s)
• name of pet(s)
A & B: Repeat dialogue (discuss A's and their teacher's living arrangements)
A & B: Summarize information given about pets and living arrangements

Key Grammar

SPATIAL AGREEMENT—ORIENTING SIGNS TO THE PERSON BEING REFERRED TO

In an earlier grammar note, you learned that, to show agreement, it is important to point to and glance at a person you are identifying. To continue to show agreement when sharing information about the person, orient your signs in the direction of the person you are talking about. For example, if you want to share information about yourself and a friend sitting on your right, information about yourself is signed directly in front of your body and information about your friend is signed slightly to the right of your body. To refer to people sitting across from you, sign the information further out in front of you to indicate the information is about the people across from you.
